In March the Carinthian company will put a new production facility into operation.

To meet today's as well as tomorrow's market requirements, TEWA invests 1,2 million Euro in a new Inliner for regular slotted boxes, which will be installed late February put to use mid-March after adjusting work and training the employees.

A leap in quality

"This is a neat leap in quality. We can produce faster and more efficiently", says Franz Ronge, CEO. 85% of the produced corrugated board is processed into packaging. Not only Austrian businesses count among TEWA's customers but also German, Hungarian, Slovenian and Croatian enterprises. The typically brown cartons only attend to transportation purposes. The future belongs to combinations between transport and sales packaging which of course need to look attractively. Thanks to the new production facility, which prints, creases, slits, die cuts, folds and bundles the cardboard cuts very efficiently, packaging will be of even higher quality than now.

A second mainstay

"Packaging that is imprinted can be produced with great precision. The customer can put it up automatically", says Ronge. Parallel to the corrugated cardboard production, the Feldkirchen based company offers their customers digital print solutions. Nearly every material can be directly printed on, for example wood or glass. TEWA, founded in 1920, currently employs 85 people.
